

DIRECTIONS TO THE BRIGHTON OFFICE

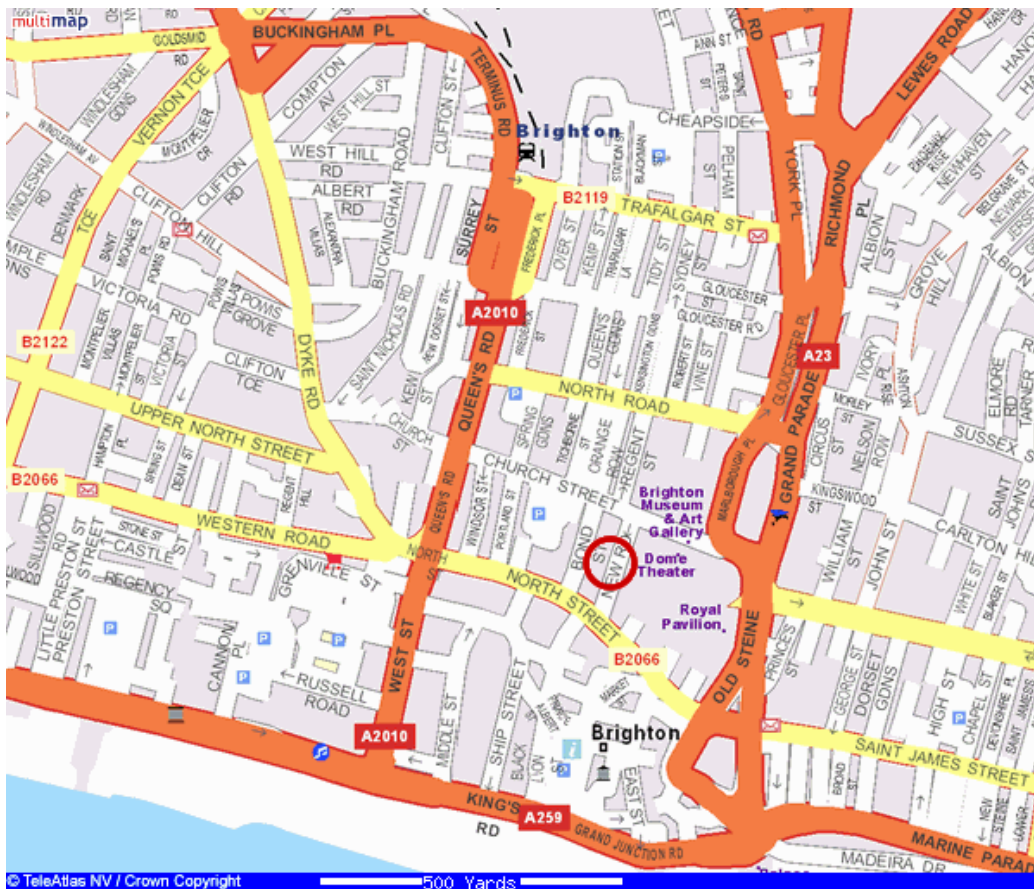

By Road

From the north, follow the M23 and A23 signs to the city centre. Enter the central one-way system by bearing left at Preston Circus (fire station on the left), then turning right at traffic lights at Ditchling Road, and continue to follow signs for the city centre and seafront. On passing St Peter's Church (prominently on the right), keep in the right hand lane and turn right at the traffic lights shortly before reaching the Royal Pavilion, turning into Church Street. Pass the Brighton Dome theatre on the left. New Road is the first turning on the left, and Pavilion View is about 25m along on the right, before reaching the Theatre Royal. For **parking**, do not turn into New Road, but continue up Church Street to the NCP Theatre Car Park which is about 50m further on the left.

From the west, use the A27 to the junction of the A23, where follow the signs for Brighton and City Centre. The route from the north (above) can then be followed.

From the east, take the A27 from the Lewes direction, then follow the A270 which breaks off to the left about 200m beyond the University of Sussex (on the right). Follow signs for the city centre, eventually reaching St Peter's Church, from where the route from the north (above) can be followed.



By rail

Southern Railway operates direct trains to Brighton station from London Victoria (platforms 15-19) in about 55 minutes on weekdays. Direct Thameslink services are available from Bedford via London King's Cross (with connections with Midland Mainline (St Pancras) and GNER East Coast services) and London Bridge, with a journey time from London stations of about 1 hour 20 minutes.

There are also regular direct weekday services from Lewes, Eastbourne, Hastings and Ashford International in the east, and Worthing, Chichester, Havant, Portsmouth and Southampton in the west. There are also less frequent direct services to and from Basingstoke, Winchester and Reading, with occasional journeys to Salisbury, Bristol and Cardiff Central. An hourly daytime service runs via Clapham Junction and Kensington Olympia to/from Watford Junction where connections can be made for Virgin Trains West Coast Route. There is one weekday direct service to Birmingham and Manchester Piccadilly.

On leaving the station, walk straight ahead along Queens Road, which slopes downhill towards the sea. At the Clock Tower, turn left into North Street. New Road is the 5th turning on the left (Zafferelli's Restaurant on the corner) and Pavilion View is about 100m along on the left, beyond the Theatre Royal. Journey time on foot is about 10 minutes. Taxis are available from the station forecourt.
